GRAND NATIONAL OPEN TEAMS (GNOT) ILLAWARRA AND SOUTHERN HIGHLANDS FINAL

This event was conducted at Bundanoon on 26 August 2018. IBA was represented by 7 teams with the entry fee being 50% subsidised by IBA. The event winner was the IBA team of Kaye Hart, Jeff Carberry, Paul Lavings and Helen Lavings who now progress to the Australian GNOT final in November 2018 at Tweed Heads. Well done.

North has a holding of 23 points with 8 tricks in hand and 3NT can be bid in the expectation of a trick from dummy. The additional trick is not immediately obvious with the opposition holding AKQJ of clubs but a club lead draws the J and Q and a second club lead drops the A and K. The declarer is then able to re-enter dummy with one of the 4 clubs being held and take the 3 remaining club tricks making a total of 11 tricks.

MOLLYMOOK BRIDGE CLUB **CONGRESS**

HUMOROUS INCIDENT

It has been reported that whilst playing a 6 NT contract, an IBA member claimed the contract after only a hand full of tricks had been played **declaring that he would play the established** 5. He may not look at the face of defenders winners in his hand and rough a losing **spade.** The opposition was stunned to hear the explanation and called the Director. Because Clubs had been prominent in the bidding the declarer thought he was playing a 6 clubs contract. He did make 6 NT however the director determined that the contract would be defeated due to the incorrect explanation of how it would be played out. Humorous and embarrassing for the member but a lesson to all the bridge table: that when 'claiming', an accurate description of how it is to be played out is essential.

ROLE OF THE DUMMY

President, Jill MacRae has submitted this interesting article.

The Director is your friend.

DUMMY HAS RIGHTS TOO BUT NOT VERY MANY. (law 42)

Absolute rights

- 1. Dummy can only give information in the directors presence.
- 2. Dummy can keep count of tricks won and lost.
- 3. Dummy plays the cards as declarers agent

Qualified rights

- 1. Dummy may ask Declarer, but not Defender when he has failed to follow suit. whether he has a card of that suit.
- 2. He may try to prevent any irregularity.
- 3. He may draw attention to any irregularity AFTER the hand has been played.

Limitations

- 1. Dummy may not initiate a call for the Director
- 2. Dummy may not participate in the play, nor communicate about play to the Declarer.
- 3. Dummy may not exchange hands with the Declarer.
- 4. Dummy may not leave his seat to watch declarer play.
- cards.

Dummy is the **SILENT** partner.
